#### **MESSAGE FROM FR JOHN**

**My warmest thanks to all who sent me cards and presents for my birthday and for Easter, and for your generous Easter offerings. It was a great pleasure to welcome so many of you back to the church last weekend, even though the Easter services had to be shortened. I hope you all had a very Happy Easter.**

Our second readings at Mass on the Sundays of the Easter season are from the first letter of St John. At the beginning of this letter the author confirms that the Word of God who gives life was genuinely seen and touched by the apostles. In the extract we read today he declares that anyone who believes that Jesus is the Son of God already shares his victory over death. The believer has access to all the help he needs to keep the commandments, which are not asking the impossible. Three witnesses assure us that Jesus has come; the Spirit of God, through whom Jesus came into the world, the water of his baptism, at which he was shown to be the Son of God, and the blood he shed when he died to save the world. But the Christian also sees the evidence these three witnesses provide. We are brought into the church by the waters of baptism, nourished by the body and blood of Jesus, and guided by the Spirit of God dwelling in us.
