MESSAGE FROM FR JOHN

Our thanks to everyone who took part in our commemoration of the death of Queen Elizabeth last weekend. There are still several sets of the prayer cards (sent from the Bishops' Conference office) available. Please feel free to take them.

The second reading this weekend is our third and final extract from the longer of the two letters attributed to St Paul, and addressed to St Timothy. Paul has devoted most of the letter to giving instructions about the organization of the Christian community, but he ends by exhorting Timothy to fight for the faith like a boxer. He looks forward to the 'Appearing', the final coming of Jesus Christ, and ends by quoting what is probably an early Christian hymn to God the Father.

DATE FOR YOUR DIARY Parish Gardening Day Saturday 15th October – 10am Our annual tidy-up before the winter, with refreshments provided for the workers! This is

what we hope to achieve:

- Remove foliage growth across door to tool shed.
- Removal of ash tree saplings (may need to identify and carry forward).
- Prune rose bushes.
- Trim high level hedges.
- Trim back over grown shrubs especially round the back of the Sacristy.
- Trim back shrubs that are obscuring windows.
- Remove ivy clinging to any walls, shed/garage roof, gate posts at entrance.
- Cut back overhanging brambles.
- Trim back overhanging trees adjacent to fire exit and brick shed.

We have some gardening equipment, but feel free to bring your own if there is a particular task you would like to take on. We hope many of you will come along to help. Many thanks.
