The second reading this weekend is our fourth extract from the early part of St Paul's first letter to the Corinthians. Their faith was not to depend on human wisdom but on the power of God.

RICKMANSWORTH CARE SCHEME

At the recent Churches Together AGM, Cathy Scarborough, our Parish Nurse, mentioned the need for volunteers to provide transport for those who are unable to use public transport for various reasons and need that little bit more support. However, it has been highlighted that an existing wellestablished organisation in our area has been doing just that for 50 years. The Rickmansworth Care Scheme was set up in the early 1970s by the then Churches Together in Croxley Green & Rickmansworth, to help people living in Croxley Green, Rickmansworth, Mill End and Maple Cross.

A similar care-in-the-community scheme operates in many areas nationwide. Chorleywood and Kings Langley are two examples near us.

Volunteers are needed to fulfil this need through the Rickmansworth Care Scheme, which is very much in need of help and support as many volunteers have not returned since COVID. Volunteering offers a very rewarding sense of community. The scheme is in need of both drivers and duty officers who take the calls and make the arrangements. Drivers can choose to do as much (or as little) as they wish and can claim expenses at 45p per mile. Duty Officers usually do two consecutive mornings every month or two.

No charge is made to the client as this ensures it is open to all. Donations however are welcomed, and earlier in the life of the scheme each church used to donate annually. Without donations the scheme would not operate. Please consider volunteering. If you would like to do so, or want further information please contact:
