Fr Dominic Robinson SJ, Chair of the Westminster Justice and Peace Commission, writes:



“Dear Friends,

These are just a few words by way of introduction to this month’s e-Bulletin to hope this finds you in good heart at this strangest and most challenging of times for all of us. This is a time when many are saying they need the community of the Church all the more. In my parish I have sensed the anxiety, fear and loneliness this crisis is bringing, and I know that in your own parish community there will be particular challenges as we face preparing for a long haul.

As we approach Holy Week we will live the journey to the cross in real time. But the cross also leads to the new life of the Risen Christ and we must keep that hope in close focus. And there are glimmers of that hope in the generosity of so many in our communities. As we realise that the poorest will be the most vulnerable through lack of food, we see how the Caritas Food Collective in many parishes is responding to this need. The homeless risk being forgotten, but thankfully many initiatives involving volunteers and other key organisations are feeding and giving them shelter. Asylum seekers, too, are being served by generous volunteers.

As a Commission, we are monitoring how this terrible crisis is affecting these most vulnerable groups and encouraging on-going advocacy for the welfare of all people, both at home and abroad, working closely with the Caritas Westminster team to respond to immediate priorities. Like many of you, we are wrestling with new technologies and changed means of communication as we try to adapt to new ways of giving support and encouragement to those staying at home and to keyworkers out in the community. Our mission, though, has not changed as we seek to respond to the needs of our times in the light of the social teaching of the Church.

As the scattered Body of Christ gathers in a new way, I pray that we can appreciate all the more how we are in communion with each other and with the earth, our common home. May we approach Easter together with faith and hope in the Risen Christ who calls us to be disciples in his kingdom of peace and justice for all”.


DIARY OF EVENTS 2020
