Parishes in Touch

A key challenge voiced by parishes in lockdown is the continuation of Sacramental Programmes, especially for First Holy Communion and Confirmation. Practical difficulties have meant that initially at least, many programmes suddenly stopped. There has been a sense of loss with plans delayed, expectations dashed. But now with determination and creativity, they are moving forward again with new vision and a new tool – the internet. The internet is helping to strengthen connections at many different layers, to build small communities with common goals, and to involve those who have been on the margins. The internet has become the new church porch, welcoming and encouraging, accessible to everyone. Parents' role as the 'first and best of teachers in the faith', in daily living as well as in preparation for the sacraments, is more active. It is a learning process, and through listening to the many voices brought together by the different media, new perspectives of what parish means for the future are emerging.
