+ THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Dear Parishioners,

“Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit...”

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, the great mystery of God at the centre our faith. We are used to hearing that there is one God and that this one God is the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, but what can we make of this mystery? God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are three divine Persons, each one distinct from the other. Each Person has a perfect intellect and free will and each one is capable of knowing and loving to a perfect degree. It is this 'perfection' of their ability to know and love that makes them one. They each share in the one divine nature and, within that divine nature, are perfectly united. This means that each one knows and loves the other perfectly which brings about a unity so profound and deep that they live and act as one God. The work of redemption, on our behalf, undertaken by the Holy Trinity is what we have been commemorating these last weeks. God so loved the world that his Son, Jesus came to die for us and now the Holy Spirit has been sent to bring us a new and improved life. We are not God, but we are made in God's image and likeness. Therefore, we find fulfilment in the same way that God does. Specifically, we find fulfilment in life by our love for God and of others and learning to love as Jesus has shown us. This will take on different forms depending upon our relationships. Let us reflect, today, as we celebrate this Trinity Sunday, on the relationships to which God has called us. How completely do we imitate the love of the Trinity in our relationships? Let us ask God to give us the grace to live this deep and beautiful mystery of life with the Holy Trinity, in increasingly profound and fulfilling ways.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL SEEKS NEW MEMBERS

The Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) is looking for a few new members to join it from September. Our role is to advise and support Fr Martin on the pastoral work of the parish. This includes:

- (a) promoting the spiritual growth and learning of everyone in the parish of all ages
- (b) encouraging as many people as possible to participate in the ministries and work of the parish
- (c) developing the social side within the parish so as to build a healthy parish community
- (d) reaching out to those in need within the parish and to people and communities outside the parish.

The PPC's work is likely to expand as we begin to explore and implement ideas that have already emerged from the parish discussions in April in preparation for the Synod. The most prominent of these ideas so far have been doing more for our young people and building a stronger community. We meet with Fr Martin every three months or so on a weekday evening for up to 90 minutes and also carry out some work between our meetings.

You don't need to have any qualifications or particular expertise but if you care about the parish and bring enthusiasm and commitment you may be just the right person.

So that we can collate the expressions of interest before the summer break and in proper time for our next meeting in September, please take 10 July as the closing date for showing interest.
