Dear Parishioners

A voice cries in the wilderness: 'Prepare a way for the Lord...'

On the Second Sunday of Advent this week we hear about John the Baptist, preaching in the desert and fulfilling the words of Isaiah's prophecy. John is the voice crying into the 'wilderness' of this world and of people's hearts and calling them to return to the right path. Advent is a time of preparation, of starting all over again. As Christians we are being prepared all life long, if we desire, to be made ready to spend eternity with God in heaven. Every second counts! This was especially true when John was preparing the people to welcome the Messiah that they had been longing for, for so long. Before the Church calls us to gather in peace and wonder around the crib in Bethlehem, she asks us to look at our hearts and our lives, to 'prepare a way for the Lord'. Jesus came to reveal the infinite love of God for each of us, so that we could rediscover our true identity as children of his that he loves. It took the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross to open up the way in the wilderness of this world, so that evil, sin and death could be defeated for us. God wants to make of our hearts a true oasis, a paradise of love, but he needs our cooperation to transform our deserts into fertile ground. Let us reflect, at this time on all that we want to bring to God this Christmas. The greatest gift we can ever give to him is our love. In this season of repentance we begin by acknowledging that in humbly asking for God's mercy and desiring to grow in holiness we do give to God a beautiful expression of our love.
