SUNDAY 26TH FEBRUARY 2023 +1ST SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear Parishioners,

'At that time Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil.'

This weekend brings us to the first Sunday of Lent when we hear about Jesus going into the desert for 40 days. This time marks the start of our Lenten preparation for the great feast of Easter. For Jesus this was a time of testing, preparation and trial. For us, the Lenten season can also be seen as a symbol of our entire life here on earth. As we begin our Lenten journey we can apply the lessons of Jesus' time in the desert to our entire lives. We see that Jesus was 'led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil.' This teaches us that Jesus not only endured temptation, he confronted it. Jesus did this throughout his mission right up the encounter with evil, sin and death on the Cross. This is where he faced these adversaries, armed with the almighty and infinite love of God, and became victorious over them for ever. All through this saving mission it was the presence and guidance of God's Holy Spirit that accompanied and helped Jesus to continue. We also hear that Jesus voluntarily fasted during his time in the desert. From this example we can understand that temperance must always be part of our lives so that we do not allow the passing things of this world to become the primary satisfaction we seek. This is also relevant to the sufferings and crosses that we encounter in life: we can also practice a certain self-denial, and not allow the difficulties we endure to discourage us or to distract us from seeking out and fulfilling the will of God. For the Christian, picking up our crosses means realising that Jesus has already picked them up for us and is always willing to help us to persevere with him. Let us reflect today upon the importance of trusting in God's love throughout our life. In all our ups and downs, joys and sorrows, blessings and crosses, let us allow ourselves to be led by God's Holy Spirit, confronting every circumstance with faith, hope and love. Let us embrace the invitation this Lent to faithfully follow our loving Lord in all ways to arrive at the great feast of Easter with joyful and purified hearts.
