Dear Parishioners,

'I came so that they might have life and have it to the full.'

On this week's 'Good Shepherd' Sunday, we particularly contemplate the way Jesus guides his Church like a shepherd and through the priests that he has appointed. Jesus tells us that he wants us to receive the fullness of life through him and his Church. He has laid down his own life so that we could know the love of God and receive mercy and grace through his Cross and Resurrection. When calling himself the Good Shepherd, Jesus tells us that each shepherd would call his own sheep and the sheep would follow their own shepherd's voice and not the others. This 'voice' of Jesus is made present to us through his Word and through the Sacraments in the Church. As we faithfully practice our faith, we are strengthened by these and helped to recognise the voice of God in our lives. Jesus also instituted the Holy Priesthood so that his voice could be heard in the world through their teaching and preaching. These pastors of the Church have been entrusted with the mission of Christ to lead God's people. Priests are called to humbly listen to God so that they never fail to shepherd God's people. God's true sheep will then recognise the voice of the Good Shepherd speaking through them. If they are faithful to all that Jesus has taught, then they will lead the sheep through the gate and become shepherds in union with the heart of the Good Shepherd. Let us reflect today, upon the image of Christ the Good Shepherd, calling to us in a variety of ways. Do we know the voice of the Shepherd? Can we clearly distinguish his voice from others? Or do we allow the many other voices of life to take precedence? Let us pray that we learn to hear God's true voice through faith and prayer. Let us also pray for good shepherds for his Church and for those discerning the call to be pastors and priests; that all the people of God may come to have life, and life to the full.
