SUNDAY 28TH MAY +PENTECOST SUNDAY

Dear Parishioners,

'There appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit...'

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost which could be seen as both the end and also just the start of the mission of Jesus Christ. Jesus has accomplished our salvation so that now we can live with the presence of the Holy Spirit. This Holy Spirit who came first to the Apostles at Pentecost has also descended upon us, transforming us and making it possible to live according to the commandments of love Jesus has left us. The Holy Trinity is a mystery of faith, in which we understand that God is three divine persons in one single eternal communion of love. God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit; each fully sharing in the one divine nature. Though They act in perfect unison, they each fulfil their unique mission: the Father is the one who sent the Son into the world and willed that he give his life for the salvation of all, the Son was sent and perfectly fulfilled the will of the Father, uniting humanity with divinity and the Holy Spirit is the promise of Father and Son who proceeds from them both and descends upon us, animating us and making it possible for us to share in the life of the most Holy Trinity through our participation in the Christian faith through our membership in the Church. At Pentecost we especially focus upon the third Person of the Blessed Trinity; the Holy Spirit, who is the great gift we have been given to live in this age. Jesus said he would send His Advocate, the Spirit of Truth, to lead us into all truth. We are now able to receive the Holy Spirit. God is now also able to live within us, making our souls his dwelling place. Heaven and earth unite within our souls. There could be nothing greater than this. Let us reflect, today, upon these holy mysteries of our faith. The way we will be able to begin to probe these mysteries is through prayerful pondering. Let us look for the workings of God within, to see him at work within our souls, savouring his presence and keeping our eyes firmly fixed on him. Now we can see the fruit of God's presence in our lives, through the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Let us ask for these gifts to be present within us, helping us to live lives of love as Jesus has commanded us to do.
