#### SUNDAY 11<sup>TH</sup> JUNE +THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST

Dear Parishioners.

"... This is my body... This is my blood... "

This Sunday, immediately following the feast of the Most Holy Trinity last week, the Church celebrates the feast of Corpus Christi, when we remember especially the gift of the body and blood of Jesus in Holy Communion. In this gift, which we receive through the Holy Mass the entire mystery of our redemption is made present. St Pope John Paul II wrote that in the Holy Mass there is a 'oneness in time' that links the Paschal Mystery, that is, the Life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus, to the moment when the Eucharist is celebrated and made present through the words of consecration. That unity between each Mass and the Paschal Mystery 'leads us to profound amazement and gratitude' (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, #5). Do we sense and experience this profound amazement and gratitude each time we attend the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass? Do we realise as we attend the Mass and as the words of consecration are spoken that the entire mystery of our redemption is made present before us, hidden from our eyes but visible to our soul by faith? Do we understand that it is God the Second Person of the Most Holy Trinity who descends to us to dwell with us in that moment of time in this glorious Sacrament? Let us reflect, today, upon this hidden but real mystery of Faith. Let us allow ourselves to be drawn into a wonder and awe at what we are privileged to attend. Let our faith in the Most Holy Eucharist grow by being open to a deepening of this gift of faith through spiritual insight and belief. If we behold this great Gift of the Eucharist with the eyes of faith we will be drawn into the wonder and awe that God wants to bestow upon God bless you, us.
