SUNDAY 18TH JUNE +ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Parishioners,

"The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."

This Sunday's readings find us returning to 'Ordinary Time' in our liturgical year. Our Gospel tells us about the calling of the Apostles. We are told that the heart of Jesus is 'moved with pity' for the crowds before him as he could see they were 'troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd.' The sight of them evoked compassion, concern and mercy from within him and led him to call others to be sent out to minister in his name and with his authority. Jesus gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. As Jesus looks at each of us, he gazes at us as he gazed at the crowds long ago. The same depths of mercy and compassion are evoked within his Sacred Heart. As we look at our own life, our struggles, our spiritual needs and our desire to grow in faith, we can ask how God has fed us? Who has God spoken to us through? Who has helped us to see and understand that God has so loved us that he has given his only Son as a sacrifice of love for our salvation? Any time we have encountered the grace of God through another, it happened because the 'master of the harvest' chose to send a labourer to us. When good fruit is borne in our life, it was God who initiated that good work through another, out of the mercy and compassion of his Son's Sacred Heart. Let us reflect, today, on the image of Jesus gazing at us with love and choosing to send his ministers to us in his name and with his authority. Let us ask the Lord of the harvest to inspire and send labourers to his harvest and that we might be also sent to others who need our love. God loves each one of us and has a heart full of compassion for each of us. Let us give thanks for this gift of faith and share it with all those God puts in our lives. God bless you,
