Dear Parishioners,

'I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'make straight the way of the Lord.'

On this third Sunday of Advent, also called Gaudete Sunday, we once again hear about John the Baptist crying out in the wilderness: prepare the way of the LORD! We are called to Rejoice as we hear this prophecy of Isaiah, who was originally speaking about the return of the Jewish exiles from Babylon back to Jerusalem. Isaiah prophesied that the Jewish exiles would travel the shortest route—straight across the desert—and that God would provide for their needs during that journey. Such a journey required much trust in the providence of God. John the Baptist, gives us the reason to rejoice, as he applies this prophecy to the coming Messiah. John was called to cry out in the desert and point people directly to Jesus, the Son of God. It was in the desert that they would discover their Saviour. John cries out in the desert because his message is for those who experience dryness, desolation, need and loss in life due to the damaging effects of evil, sin and death. John's message of repentance calls all people to return and receive the spiritual nourishment God wants to bestow upon them through grace. The message of John is pointed to those who humbly see the difficult situation they are facing in life and acknowledge their need for the living water of the Saviour of the world. When Jesus came amongst us, he was only here for 33 years: just long enough for him to make a straight path to the Cross in order to liberate the human race from darkness and death. Advent is a time to re-examine the path we are on. Are we trying to find our own way to happiness? Are we trusting in our own abilities, our own intelligence and our own plan for the future? If so, then let us listen to the 'voice of one crying out in the wilderness', calling us to a greater detachment from all things, to an abandonment of all that is not of God, and to a more willing trust in the providence of God to lead us. Let us already rejoice on this Gaudete Sunday, that we now have the means to find joy in our lives, because our Saviour is coming. God Bless you, Fr Martin
