Andrew found his own brother Simon and told him "We have found the Messiah"

To start us off in this period of Ordinary Time in our liturgical year, this Sunday we hear about the calling of the first Disciples. Andrew was a follower of John the Baptist who directed him to Jesus by saying "Behold, the Lamb of God."
