THE VIGIL LAMP AT OUR LADY burns this coming week in LOVING MEMORY OF

JOHN HINDE

Dear Parishioners,

'Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace."

In this Sunday's Gospel we hear about Jesus' cleansing of the Temple in Jerusalem. John's Gospel places this event at the very beginning of Jesus' public ministry during the first of his three annual trips to the capital for the Passover. Jesus cries out that the money-changers have turned his Father's House into a "marketplace." The Jewish Temple, at the time of Jesus' public ministry, was the place people travelled to each year for Passover to offer the sacrifice of a spotless male lamb in commemoration of the first Passover in Egypt when God set the Jews free from slavery. During this annual celebration, Jewish families who travelled to Jerusalem would purchase a lamb for sacrifice. Today, we see the Jewish Temple as a symbol and prefiguration of Christ, the New Temple who is also the priest and the Lamb of Sacrifice. At Jesus' death, the veil of the Temple was torn in two, opening it up to the whole world so that all may now share in the sacrifice of the Lamb of God. We are all now invited into this holy of holies to share in the new life of grace accomplished by this sacrifice. We are called to allow the grace of this sacrifice of Jesus to enter into our hearts, to cleanse and purify us, so that every person receiving this grace can become a new dwelling place of God, a member of his new temple, the Body of Christ. Let us reflect, today, upon this twofold cleansing of the Temple in Jerusalem by our Lord and apply Jesus' sacred actions today to our own soul. Are there sins in our lives that require cleansing? Let us allow Jesus to cleanse us so that his saving sacrifice as the new Passover Lamb will indeed purify us and liberate us in his service and love. This week we pray especially for the grace to see how God is calling us to participate in our parish through volunteering ourselves in a more fruitful and fulfilling way.

This Lent we are considering our involvement in our parish in various ways. Using the acronym **LOVE** – we are; **Looking** at ourselves, our **Offerings** to the church, **Volunteering** our time, the place of the **Eucharist** and prayer. This week we will consider our generosity with our selves, our time, our talents and generally how we participate spiritually and socially in our parish by volunteering ourselves. The parish is a primary place where the participation in the Body of Christ, which is the Church, takes place with our brothers and sisters.
