Dear Parishioners,

'Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them.'

This Sunday of Lent we hear about the glorious Transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor. Six days before this amazing event, Jesus had spoken for the first time to his disciples about his approaching crucifixion, death and Resurrection. As usual, the Apostles had a difficult time accepting this teaching. Jesus went on to further explain that whoever follows him must also up their own cross. The disciples then had six days to ponder this prophecy of our Lord before witnessing the Transfiguration. After giving these disciples six days to assimilate the difficult news of his coming Cross, Jesus gives them hope and inspiration through this sacred encounter on the mountain. Though it lasted for only a short time, this manifestation of Jesus' glory surely helped these disciples to begin to accept Jesus' prediction of his passion. On one hand, they feared what Jesus said was going to happen, but on the other hand, they saw his glory and majesty. By combining these two experiences, these disciples were given a new hope and strength to trust that whatever was to happen in the future, God was in control. We ourselves also need the consoling revelation of our Lord's glory to help us navigate the ups and downs of life. At times, life is good and we go forward with joy and ease but then it happens that life has taken a difficult turn and confusion has set in. The Cross of Christ comes in many forms throughout life. At all times God is calling us in faith to trust in his everlasting love and his plan for our lives. Let us reflect, today, upon this vision on the holy mountain of Tabor. As we climb our own mountains in life, with perseverance and determination, let us accept the hope and joy that is given to us. Let us pray for the ability to trust in the Son of God who not only died a cruel death but also is radiant in glory for all eternity.
