Dear Parishioners,

'Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified.

He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said.'

We have arrived at our solemn celebration of the passion, death and Resurrection of Jesus. This is where evil, sin and death are destroyed and new life is offered to all who come to the Saviour in faith. This is the heart of the Gospel message that the Church is to offer now to the human race in every generation until the end of time. The Church gives so much solemnity and importance to this celebration because Easter is worth it. Nothing ever has been and nothing ever will be more glorious than the triumph of the Son of God over sin and death. Easter fills us with awe and wonder. Through the death and Resurrection of Jesus, our lives are changed forever. God's glorious plan of salvation unfolds over time and then culminates with a glory beyond our imagination. At times in life, we can become impatient with ourselves and with others. We suffer and struggle with the circumstances of life and we tend to want what we want and to want it now. Let us believe in the promise of the Resurrection and make it our one and only hope in life, letting Jesus Christ lead us to his risen glory.
