"I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'?

But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour."

This Sunday, as we get closer to the events of Holy Week, we hear that Jesus was 'troubled.' Jesus also identifies the possible temptation to be saved from this 'hour.' Jesus dismisses the temptation in order to proceed with the great work of redemption that he is to accomplish for us. As God, Jesus has perfect strength to always remains faithful to the mission he receives from his Father. At the same time, as a man, Jesus permits himself to experience temptation and human suffering. In doing so, Jesus shows us that he identifies with us in every way and also makes it possible for us to imitate him in our suffering because we will endure similar temptations through life. What is it that causes us fear and anxiety as we look at our lives? How can we look at this in the light of the witness of Jesus? Jesus brings meaning into the phenomenon of suffering and invests it with a salvific power. He came to suffer the consequences of our sins and to destroy death itself. By offering up our own suffering through Jesus, we can share in this great work of redemption and assist in the salvation of our own soul and of the souls of all the world. Jesus embraced his Cross by looking at it through the lens of glory. Jesus allowed himself to see the Cross as a glorification of the Father. The same can happen in our lives. No matter what we face in life, no matter the cross we encounter, if we can embrace it, then we can see it as an act by which God will be glorified in our lives. This truer perspective will bring with it hope, joy and strength which will free us from the anxiety caused by fear. At the same time, this does not mean that we should not use all our God-given capacities to see where suffering can be alleviated and healed by grace and our own efforts. Let us reflect, today, upon the ways in which God is calling us to the cross. As we do, let us pray to see every suffering as an opportunity to glorify God in our life. Let us ask to be able to see our crosses with gratitude and joy, and allow this new perspective to give us the strength we need to fulfil the mission given to us by our Father in heaven.
