Dear Parishioners,

'Look at my hands and my feet...

Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have.'

On this third Sunday of Easter we hear about another Resurrection appearance of Jesus to his Apostles. Jesus helps them to understand that he is not a vision or apparition but truly there flesh and blood, but now risen and glorified. This invites us to imagine: what if we were in the same position and Jesus appeared to us. Would we believe? It would certainly be the beginning of an experience that would be life-changing, just as it was for the disciples. They were transformed from men who were confused and doubtful to men who were filled with joy and zeal. Eventually, they would go forth preaching with courage and faith in Jesus as witnesses to his death and Resurrection. Today, we are entrusted with the same mission given to our Lord's disciples, to live and to preach with our lives with the same zeal, courage and conviction as them. This also involves becoming as certain as they were about Jesus' triumph over sin and death. Which also means being willing to turn from all sin and believing that the fullness of life is found only in Christ Jesus and his love. It might be tempting to think that only having Jesus appear to us in person would give us the same faith as the Apostles. However, this gift is offered to us today, just as it was to the first followers of Jesus. In what ways has God revealed his love, his presence, his truth and his mercy to us in our lives. This season of Eastertide is a time to be confirmed in our faith and to pray to be more aware of the mystery of God in us. Let us reflect, today, upon our own knowledge of Jesus and the transforming power of his Resurrection in our life. Have we heard God speaking to us within the depths of our soul? Let us desire to see and listen attentively to God. We may not see him like the Apostles but we can come to know him in our spirit. It is there, within us, that we will come to know and believe in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ so that we can then go forth empowered to proclaim these truths to others.
