A Letter From Our Parish Priest

Dear Parishioners,

Jesus uses the image of a vine and its branches to symbolise his relationship with us, his disciples. The branches of a vine cannot bear fruit unless they remain attached to the vine, from which they draw nourishment, but it is equally true that the vine cannot produce fruit without those branches from which the fruit develops. If the branches grow too far from the vine, the quality of their fruit declines, which is why those branches need to be pruned regularly, in order to maintain that quality.

We need to remain close to Christ in order to receive the grace that he offers us, so that we can bear fruit in reflecting his love in the world. It is equally true that Christ needs each one of us to be his eyes and ears, his arms and legs, to spread his redeeming love to those around us.

Just as the branches of a vine need to be pruned to maximise the quality of their fruit, so we need to be constantly brought closer to Christ, who is the source of spiritual life for each one of us. It is through our openness to his word, and to the gifts of the Holy Spirit that we find the grace to help us remain close to the Lord, and thus more able to bear fruit in sharing his love in the world.

St. John reminds us that our love must not be mere talk, but should be something real and active. It is in our openness to God's grace that we are able to remain strong in faith, and more effective in reflecting his love to those around us.


MOTHERS PRAYERS GROUP

NEW AUXILIARY BISHOP


