ST ALBAN

Parish Newsletter – 22nd November 2020 +OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, King of the Universe

First reading: Ezekiel 34: 11-12,15-17
Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28
Gospel: Matthew 25: 31-46

The First Reading is taken from chapter 34 of the book of Ezekiel, the parable of the shepherds and the sheep (see Ezekiel 34:1-31 for the complete parable). The 'shepherds of Israel' were the leaders of the Israelites during the Babylonian exile (587-538bc). Active during this time, the prophet Ezekiel was very critical of their lack of leadership. They allowed 'the sheep of Israel' (the Israelite people) to become 'lost' while in exile. Ezekiel describes these 'lost sheep' as the 'injured' and the 'sick' among them-the most vulnerable of those in exile. In today's reading, Ezekiel informs these leaders of God's response to this lack of leadership: "I myself will pasture my sheep." Ezekiel also informs the exiled Israelites of God's coming in judgement of them (the sheep), saying that at the end time he will separate those who will be saved from those who will be condemned. Ezekiel's point is clear. In the end, both the sheep and the sheepherds are held accountable to judgement by God.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus speaks of himself as the 'eschatological shepherd,' assigned by God at the end of time to judge all people and to lead his sheep into the Kingdom of Heaven. Like Ezekiel, Jesus makes it clear that those who reach out to the most vulnerable in society (the hungry, the naked, the sick and the prisoner) will be the sheep on his right who are led into the Kingdom of Heaven.
