## First reading: Job 38: 1, 8-11 <br> Psalm <br> Second reading: <br> Gospel: <br> O give thanks to the Lord, for his love endures forever. 2 Corinthians 5: 14-17 <br> Mark 4: 35-41

Today's Scriptures set us in the midst of a raging sea, a mighty force of nature that only the Word of God can restrain. Anyone who has witnessed the violent winds and lashing waves of a storm at sea understands the terror of the disciples and the fearful hearts of the sailors described in today's Responsorial Psalm.

In Biblical tradition, the sea-particularly its stormy side-symbolizes chaos, all that threatens peace and well-being. Such was the experience of both Job and the disciples. Job's whole life had become an uncontrollable storm, having suddenly lost both family and possessions (see chapter 1-2). And the disciples, while attracted enough to Jesus to leave all and follow him, were still perplexed by his power and perhaps troubled by the negative reactions he sometimes received (see Mark 3: 21-22).

In today's Scriptures, God's power over the storm is revealed in the midst: 'The Lord addressed Job our of the storm' (38:1). Jesus was in the boat with his disciples during the storm. Like the sailors of Psalm 107, 'they cried to te Lord in their distress; from their straits he rescued them." The Word of God hushes the storm and stills the sea. In the midst of the storm, Job, the sailors and the disciples all receive at least a glimpse of who God is and experience God's 'kindness and wonderous deeds.'

What wisdom for us as we encounter the storms of our own lives! What seems to be chaos, to threaten our very lives, is but the setting in which the power of the Divine can be revealed. Let us not forget the Teacher will not let us perish. The power of his Word can still our storms as well.

## EASING LOCKDOWN GUIDELINES

As the rules for coming out of the lockdown are being relaxed across the country, so we are allowed to ease some of the restrictions in church. From this weekend we will revert to distributing Holy Communion at its rightful time. We will follow the pattern of coming for Communion that has been set this past year, only returning to your places after receiving before the Concluding Rite. We will still use the side doors to exit the church at the end of mass. The minister distributing Communion is allowed to say 'The Body of Christ' to each communicant again. The communicant is encouraged to respond 'Amen'. The presentation of gifts at the offertory time may take place again. However, we must continue to exercise caution, the virus has not gone away! Continue to wear masks, (unless you have a medical reason not to), keep a safe distance from others outside your 'bubble' and sanitize your hands on entering and leaving the church and before coming to receive Holy Communion. We are obliged to continue to take details of those entering the church for track and trace purposes. To that end I once again thank our volunteer stewards who have been so generous with their time and energy over the last year.

This Tuesday, June $22^{\text {nd }}$, we celebrate the feast of St. Alban, our patronal saint. It might be good to consider attending mass that morning and join in our mass of thanksgiving for this faith community.
