The second reading finally names all three members of the Trinity explicitly on this Trinity Sunday. St. Paul uses their names as a greeting, one we still use at Mass today. This is a powerful greeting. We begin everything we do in the names of these three persons in one God. The familiarity of this triad—Father, Son, and Spirit—can make us forget that there is a beautiful mystery at play here. God's very essence is relationship, is love, to the point that God needs to be three persons so that the love has someplace to go.

We live out the mystery of the Trinity in the ongoing dance of all our human relationships. As the ancient hymn "Ubi Caritas" remind us, wherever love is, God is present. God is the source and sustenance of all the different ways we experience love in our human relationships.
