"Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last" A common reaction to this gospel is to feel affronted: it really does seem unfair that all the laborers receive the same wage for unequal amounts of work. But Jesus is once again telling us that God's logic does not follow ours. Our sense of justice is too small. God's generosity is always bigger than what we had envisioned, and then is bigger again still. Part of the problem is that most of us identify with the early laborers in the story. We believe we have put in the work and really deserve good things God gives us and will give us. But none of us really deserves the gifts of God; they are not something that can be earned but are by their nature free and gracious gifts. And God promises us the free and undeserved generosity that the latecomers receive in this parable.
