Mark's depiction of Jesus is often noted for its frenetic pace, and that whirlwind is on full display in this passage. Jesus meets need after need, and he responds time and time again. He heals those with whom he has a connection, like Simon's mother-in-law, and he heals those who come to him as strangers. All who encounter him leave changed by the encounter, but at the speed he's working it's hard to see how he'd have time to interact personally, to see each person wholly as they are. Even at his frenetic pace, Jesus also prioritises prayer he rises early, before the crowds can catch him, and he finds a deserted place. There is perhaps a bit of tension here between his mission—"for this purpose have I come"—and his very human need to be alone, to regroup, to spend time with God.
