Mary's Meals

a simple solution to world hunger

Mary's Meals will be coming to our church on SATURDAY EVENING 26th and SUNDAY 27th SEPTEMBER to take away your unwanted textiles, clothes, shoes, belts, bedding, (no duvets or pillows please) Please put your unwanted items into black sacks and bring them to Mass where the charity Mary's Meals will be here to pick them up. Not only will you be having a good clear-out and giving yourself a little more space but you will also benefit a really worthwhile charity.

Amazingly, 3 full black sacks of reasonable quality clothing will feed a child one good nutritious meal every school day for a whole year!

Mary's Meals is a charity that sets up school feeding programmes in communities where poverty and hunger prevent children from gaining an education. The charity feeds children one good meal every day at school in over 12 countries. Because of their low costs, they can do this for as little as £12.20 per child per year!

Due to the way the charity is run, 93 pence out of every pound is spent on their activities, with only 7 pence being spent on fundraising and administration
