

THE FEAST OF ST. VINCENT PALLOTTI

Friday 22nd January 2016



Vincent Pallotti was born in Rome on April 21, 1795. At the age of sixteen, he resolved to become a priest, and was ordained on May 16, 1820. Pallotti worked selflessly looking after the poor in the urban areas of the city for most of his life. He organized schools for shoemakers, tailors, coachmen, carpenters, and gardeners so that they could better work at their trade, as well as evening classes for young farmers and unskilled workers. He once dressed up as an old woman to hear the confession of a man who threatened "to kill the first priest who came through the door". In 1835, he founded the Society of the Catholic Apostolate, a community of priests and brothers. The Society was placed under the protection of Mary, Queen of Apostles. During the cholera plague in 1837, Pallotti constantly endangered his life in ministering to the stricken. He had an intense devotion to the mystery of the Blessed Trinity, and to the Virgin Mary. His contemporaries, including the pope, considered him a saint during his life. The aim of the Pallottines is to assist all in finding and living their apostolic vocation in life. St. Vincent Pallotti believed that all are called to revive faith, rekindle charity and be apostles. The Pallottines assist people in living these virtues.
