Peace as a Journey of Hope

Peace is a great and precious value, the object of our hope and the aspiration of the entire human family. Hope is the virtue that inspires us and keeps us moving forward, even when obstacles seem insurmountable. Many times, in the darkness of wars and conflicts, the remembrance of even a small gesture received can lead to courageous and even heroic decisions. It can unleash new energies and kindle new hope in both individuals and communities. We cannot truly achieve peace without a convinced dialogue between men and women who seek the truth beyond ideologies and differing opinions. Peace must be built up continually, it is a journey made together in constant pursuit of the common good, truthfulness and respect for law. Listening to one another can lead to mutual understanding and esteem, even to seeing in an enemy the face of a brother or sister.
