In today’s gospel, Jesus reminds us of the great value of little things in our Christian life. From a human point of view the resources they had were totally useless, a little boy’s five barley loaves and two fish. However, God has the power to turn them into something exceedingly abundant! And to think it all started with just that: something little.

“Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, “Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted (Jn 6: 11-12.)”

Don’t forget that this miracle would not have happened without the generosity of a little boy, whose mother had probably made a picnic for him.

Holiness is made up of the little things each day carried out with generosity and love. God doesn’t expect great acts of heroism but rather, the heroism in the little things of our daily life done out of love.

Let us pray that we may learn to trust more in God’s merciful love, compassion and providence, generously giving and making use of whatever means we have at our disposal and at the same time, value and discover God in the little things we do each day, carried out with love.
