Reflection for today

Today is Trinity Sunday. The full nature of God is a mystery which men and women have struggled to grasp and to express. The doctrine of the Trinity affirms that God has been made known in the world in three characteristic ways, as Father, as Son and as Holy Spirit. The way in which the early church chose to express this mystery was in terms of "three persons in one God". Today's Gospel reading from John's account of Jesus' teaching during his last supper with his disciples provides biblical roots for the distinctive activities of God as Father, Jesus as Son and the Holy Spirit.

Returning to Mass at Corpus Christi, the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, Sunday 19th June

In May, the Bishops of England and Wales issued a call to Catholics who are not impeded by ill health or other serious reasons to return to Mass at Pentecost. We renew that call now here in the parish of Greenford with an invitation to return to Mass for the feast of Corpus Christi next Sunday, 19th June. As the Bishops write:-

A beautiful hallmark of the Catholic faith is the profound desire to participate in the Holy Mass and share in the Eucharist. We do so with deep gratitude and joy. The Eucharist gives the Church her identity "The Eucharist makes the Church, and the Church makes the Eucharist." It enables us to worship Almighty God, to support each other on our journey of faith, and to be a visible sign of faith in the world. This hallmark is supported and strengthened by the precept that our fundamental Christian duty is to worship God by participating in the celebration of Mass. Attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is the greatest of all privileges, sometimes referred to as "the Sunday Obligation".

"Virtual viewing" of Mass online be a source of continual spiritual comfort to those who cannot attend Mass in person, for example those who are elderly and sick, for whom the obligation does not apply. In this context, we recognise gratefully the ministry of those who administer Holy Communion to the elderly, sick and housebound. For those who are not housebound, this is a strong invitation to resume attendance at Mass on Sundays.

In the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the Lord's Supper, the Lord Jesus entrusted to us the precious gift of Himself. With humility, we glory in being a Eucharistic people for whom attendance at Mass is essential. Looking forward, we now invite all Catholics who have not yet done so to return to attending Mass in person.

As the Church needs the witness of the presence of each person, so too each believer needs to journey in faith and worship with their fellow disciples. Nourished by our encounter with the Risen Lord Jesus, fed with His Word and His Body and Blood in Holy Communion, and supported by the presence of each other, we receive strength week by week, to serve the Lord and glorify Him with our lives.
