responsibility for evangelization, Pallotti insisted that lay people, too, have the obligation and the right to actively participate in the mission of the Church. To this end, he founded the Union of Catholic Apostolate in 1835, bringing together priests, men and women religious, and lay people in order to collaborate in the apostolic mission of Jesus Christ—of living and spreading the Good News in whatever way they are able. Pallotti wrote, "Anyone can excel in the good of the apostolate and can indeed even exceed the achievements of the Apostles, because God judges the perfection and value of the work of his creatures according to the intentions of their hearts and the abilities of each."

"My God, my Mercy, my Paradise, you have given me the desire to work for Your glory and for the salvation of souls; increase this desire in me so that I do not wish anything other than an infinitely burning flame for all that contributes to Your glory and to the salvation of my neighbour."

Almighty and ever living God, you glorified Vincent Pallotti and made him a powerful intercessor in heaven. We come before you with our petitions and place before you all our needs and cares. Above all we place before you this our special need ... (mention).

O glorious St. Vincent, intercede for us before the Lord and obtain for us all the graces which we seek. Merciful Father, St. Vincent glorified you before all while here on earth. Now glorify him, by answering his prayers on our behalf. We make this prayer through Christ Our Lord. Amen.
