Mindfulness the Ignatian Way (www.ignatianspirituality.com)

At the start of each new year newspapers and magazines are full of ways to encourage us to re-create ourselves, change our diet, exercise, attitude to finance, friendships, work and many other areas of life. The year 2020 is no exception and perhaps even more hyped because it marks the start of a new decade. Many articles seek to help us improve our mental health and frequently focus on mindfulness to do this. More than 400 years ago St. Ignatius Loyola encouraged prayer-filled mindfulness by proposing what has been called the Daily Examen. The Examen is a technique of prayerful reflection on the events of the day in order to detect God's presence and to discern his direction for us. This is very worthwhile so why not give it a try? It might make Dry/Vegan/Weight-loss January more bearable!!

- 1) Ask God for Light—I want to look at my day with God's yes, not merely my own.
- 2) Give thanks—The day I have just lived is a gift from God. Be grateful for it.
- 3) Review the day—I carefully look back on the day just completed, being guided by the Holy Spirit.
- 4) Face your shortcomings—I face up to what is wrong—in my life and in me.
- 5) Look toward the day to come—I ask where I need God in the day to come.

OPEN DOORS 2019 WORLD WATCH LIST

"IF ONE PART SUFFERS, EVERY PART SUFFERS WITH IT." 1 CORINTHIANS 12:26

The latest World Watch list shows 260m Christians in 50 countries face high or extreme levels of persecution for their faith. (up by 15m on 2018) Persecution comes in many forms, from the Easter Sunday church attacks by Islamic extremists in Sri Lanka, to a believer being denied their rights or ostracised by their family and community. The top 10 worst countries include Somalia, India, Iran, Pakistan. N.Korea tops the list. Many parts of Africa are becoming increasingly dangerous for Christians. In the past two years, China in position 23 has risen sharply on the World Watch List - from 43 in 2018. Increasingly, churches are pressured and monitored by the state. Children under 18 are banned from attending church. Religion is banned from the public sphere, and teachers and medical staff have been pressured to sign documents saying they have no religious faith. The online sale of Bibles was banned in 2018.
