On Thursday the 4th of July is the general election and we [have to](#) get ready for that. And it means, [first of all](#), a willingness to get involved and vote. Now that might seem obvious, but voting is a privilege that we have and so I want to encourage especially younger people, 18 plus for whom this is the first opportunity to vote in a general election, do it. It means you've got to get registered by the 18th of June. Please, find out how that's done. You've got to be on the electoral register. Secondly, engage with the candidates in any way that you can. You want to know what your candidate will think and say on your behalf when that candidate gets into Parliament. And there are lots of questions you might want to ask. There's a kind of theme, though, that I would like to put forward for us all to think about, and that is, **how do we [seek](#) to construct a society in which families can flourish? Now that's the bedrock.** That's the basic idea and all sorts of things flow from that. And [so](#) on the Bishops Conference website, there are 7 main themes that are explored, but that [the flourishing families is at the heart of them.](#) [So](#) for example, we look at criminal justice. Now that it depends a lot on the stability of family life. We look at poverty and plenty. How do we adjust and best share the resources of this society? We look at international affairs, we look at education important for the flourishing of family life. We look at the environment and how we're responsible for that. And of course, we look at life issues, the beginning, the ending of life, the principles that are so crucial to our mutual respect and our regard for one another. These are some of the themes that you will find on this website and I ask you to look at them, explore them, become a bit more familiar with them so that when it comes to the 4th of July and when you vote, especially if you're doing it for the first time, you've got in your mind what you want to see the next government strive to achieve.
