The Scapegoat ... William Holman Hunt

In 1854 the PreRaphaelite painter, William Holman Hunt, travelled twice to Jerusalem and the area around the Dead Sea to research material for this painting. Hunt, who was a deeply religious man, considered a trip to the land of Christ's birth essential for the creation of such a religious painting. The 'Scapegoat' is mentioned in the Book of Leviticus. Verses from both Leviticus and Isaiah undoubtedly can be interpretated as a foreshadowing of Christ's sacrifice: "Surely he hath borne out Griefs and carried our Sorrows; Yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of GOD and afflicted (Isaiah 53:4) and "And the Goat shall bear upon him all their iniquities unto a Land not inhabited (Leviticus 16:22).

I am considering commissioning a large, high-quality reproduction of this painting to install in the church. The cost will be covered by a private donation. Please let me have your thoughts on this.

Mothering Sunday
