The story of doubting Thomas is a story about us. We latch on to it because of its human interest, and imagine ourselves as not doubting when put to the test as he was. But surely all the disciples were 'doubting' until Jesus appeared to them the first time? They weren't expecting it, they were filled with joy. This is John's equivalent of the road to Emmaus; they didn't recognise Jesus either, even when he was walking beside them. Thomas was simply being honest, and if we are honest we will admit we would do the same as him. We are those who 'have not seen'; pray that we may be among those who are blessed because we believe. There is much more in the Gospel than Thomas, anyway; the greeting 'Peace be with you', the commissioning of the disciples to go out as Jesus himself was sent. The second Reading anticipates the Gospel - if it was read afterwards it would be a perfect fit, as it begins with Whoever believes that Jesus is the Christ has been begotten by God. The theme of faith continues triumphantly; if we have faith, we have overcome the world. All it takes to be able to say with Thomas, 'My Lord and my God'.
