

The Resurrection stories of Jesus have all been told and from now to Pentecost the Gospels are from the teaching of Jesus before his passion and death, while the first and second readings are vivid illustrations of the life of the Church both on earth and in heaven. Today's first reading is the only one not to talk in so many words about shepherds, lambs or sheep. However, the preaching of Paul and Barnabas added to the flock of believers, of which (as part of that flock today) we can all confess our membership by singing the psalm response. Much history has passed in the reading of Acts since last week. The second reading shows the flock of Christ in a state of blessedness. One might question whether at the time of writing there were enough deceased Christians to constitute a huge number, impossible to count; but others will be in heaven, even if they have not 'passed through the great persecution' which in the Roman empire had started in the AD60s or so. The Gospel is a short passage but it defines who is one of the flock: one who listens to Jesus's voice, and follows him. This is the condition for attaining eternal life.
