After the excitement of Easter, what do we do this week? We acclaimed the Resurrection a week ago, but today we read about someone who doubted it - and not just anyone, but someone who was in the very inner circle of Jesus's followers.

We may be tempted to think we are better than Thomas, and wouldn't possibly have

doubted it. In fact we are all Thomas, and the church today is the room where the disciples were gathered. We don't see Jesus in the way they did, but we see Him present in the gathered congregation, in the person of the priest and especially on the altar; and as we listen to the scriptures it is He who is actually talking to us. And yet... it is only the eyes and ears of faith that tell us this. How does this Gospel story work? In his appearances after the Resurrection, it is Jesus who personally shows himself to Mary Magdalene and then today to the disciples. On our own we cannot know that Jesus is alive - He has to show himself to us, which generally happens through other Christians in whom we recognise His face. Can we say when this happened to us?
