A group of Pharisees warned Jesus to flee because Herod was looking for him to kill him. The Pharisees seem to have been ambivalent towards Jesus, inviting him to their houses to eat, as today, but watching him ‘closely’. Although a guest, he took charge of the gathering quite soon, lecturing his host and the whole gathering on questions of etiquette. He starts off with an uncontroversial point, warning people not to assume they are the most important person present and take the best place, lest they have to give it up to someone more important. He then comes to the more important part of his discourse, saying who should be invited to dinner in the first place. The Psalm puts it - ‘The greater you are, the more you should behave humbly;’ and ‘you prepared a home for the poor.’ Jesus tells his host to behave like this. He should not invite people who will return his courtesy but to people who have no chance of doing any such thing – the crippled, lame and blind. These were classes of people conventionally shunned at the time; Luke adds to this list ‘the poor’, which shows that what he is talking about is not an ordinary banquet but the all-embracing banquet of the Kingdom.
