## DEVELOPING WORLD GROUP

On 1 December we sent £680 to pay for an oven (to cook food and provide heat), a table and chairs for a youth centre in a township in the Dundee diocese in Natal. Most of the beneficiaries are orphans from across the township, who meet and learn practical skills at the centre (which does not receive government grants, relying instead entirely on donations.) We are now working with the Columban Fathers to fund the purchase of a large hand pump for a village (of mainly low caste Hindus) in the Thar Parkar desert in south-east Pakistan. We will provide more information when the project gets under way. Between 13<sup>th</sup> November and 11<sup>th</sup> December, parishioners donated £61.86 in cash, together with £438.00 in standing orders.
