Blood and death occur a lot in the scriptures during Lent and Easter. We don't really like to contemplate this fact. As the disciples were indignant when Jesus foretold the destiny he would meet in Jerusalem. But they could not see beyond the death, in spite of his telling them of rising from the dead, which they did not understand - and in spite of the Transfiguration, which might have helped them to do so. This vision lifts the veil on Easter and showed that this man with whom the disciples walked every day was more than they ever suspected. A cloud fell, which frightened them, and they heard the voice of God speaking from it. Is God frightening? God only seems frightening to us in our present state, with 'wretched bodies'. Paul speaks from a world lighted by the Resurrection; he himself had had a transfiguration experience on the road to Damascus, and knew that a glorified body awaits those who remained faithful to Christ.
