Today we have one of the essential passages of the Hebrew Scriptures. God appears to Moses, and commissions him to lead the people out of Egypt; and finally reveals the divine Name. This is really the beginning of the chosen people following the Lord Yahweh, a name so sacred it is never said aloud. Having seen the burning bush, Moses is afraid to look at God, who tells him to take off his shoes 'for this is holy ground.' Paul describes some of the life of the chosen people after Moses had led them out of Egypt - they did not heed the holiness of God, and many of them died in the desert. This is to be a warning to us, who live 'at the end of the age'. The Gospel is another warning, using two real events and a parable to shake us out of complacency. Jesus is not saying that the people who died in the disasters were killed for their sinfulness; what he means is that disaster can affect us at any moment and we need to be prepared, repentant. It may not be what we have done but what we have failed to do - the man with the fig tree will cut it down if it does not produce fruit.
