Some people may be slightly irritated by Job the whinger. We are encouraged to think of ourselves as living in the best of all possible worlds, or at least that it is within our grasp if we obey certain commercial imperatives. But even inside the comfortable cocoon of a peaceful Western democracy there are some who live in misery and even slavery, which makes today a suitable one for thinking about victims of trafficking. From the point of view of such a person, Job is describing their whole life. Then there are the sick - both in body and in mind (the closest equivalent we can think of to 'those possessed by devils.' Life is pretty grim for some people who may be quite close to us, even in our congregation, our circle of friends and our families. Anything to relieve the pain will be eagerly sought, and once Jesus's abilities as a healer became known 'the whole town' of Capernaum came and besieged the house where he was. They could have said with justification Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted. But what about those who come away from Lourdes still uncured? Who pray for healing and still die? Only God knows the reason, but if there is a God we can trust in him to heal us in the end.
