

The Psalm explains why they are called Kings, and two of the gifts, gold and incense, are anticipated in Isaiah. The third, myrrh, was prized as a perfume and is mentioned several times in the Hebrew scriptures. In the Gospels the only other mentions are in connection with Jesus's death. St. Mark says he was offered wine and myrrh to drink on the cross; in St. John Nicodemus brings myrrh and aloes to Jesus in the tomb. So Jesus even as an infant is acknowledged by the whole world, symbolised by the Magi, as King of the Jews; and there is surely an anticipation of his destiny. There is a greater meaning to this than the picturesque Crib figures and the splendid costumes for the children in the nativity play. What makes it easier to appreciate this feast is the fact that it is already psychologically distant from Christmas. We are looking ahead to the new year and not backward to last school term.
