Today we celebrate the wise men (not in fact themselves kings) who come to adore the infant King of the Jews. In the Psalm we have 'the king' and the 'king's son.' who will be drawn to the brightness of the Lord in Jerusalem. Last but not least there is King Herod. Kings have, at best, a mixed press in the scriptures. Stripping away, therefore, most of what we think about the Epiphany (Caspar, Melchior, Balthasar, crowns and camels), what does the liturgy teach us? The nations of the world, their rulers and their great men, will be drawn by the light of God to pay homage to Jesus Christ and acknowledge him as their ruler. A mystery has only now been revealed; that God is God of all the earth, pagans as well as Jews. That God has appeared on earth in this child. Here is the most poignant image in Matthew's whole nativity story: venerable wise men doing homage to a baby. Christmas is 'so last year' by now but this is the last visit to Bethlehem, the last sight of a baby. Next week we see Jesus the man.
