Today, though they are not long, there is drama in the Word of God; to appreciate it fully we have to think of ourselves as participants in it, not spectators of some long-forgotten historical curiosity. There is an art in listening to the readings which, after nearly fifty years, we have not learned. The first reading sets the scene, and implicates us with its last sentence: Whether they listen or not... It finishes abruptly. Are we listening? The question should put us on the defensive, so the psalm response 'Our eyes are on the Lord till he show us his mercy' comes as a reminder that we can always rely on God's love. We may ourselves be prophets, but is anyone listening to us? In the Gospel Christ is the one who is not listened to. It is not good enough for us to say: we are not like that, we hear Jesus' words and take them to heart.
