Every Sunday we recite the Creed and may possibly imagine that this is all there is to be said about Christian belief. But the creed only gets us to the starting point. There is nothing about loving God or our neighbour; there is nothing about the Kingdom of God. It is entirely unpoetic. It is also nothing like what we hear in the Gospel, which should tell us that the Gospel is the place to look for what we believe. What a difference it would make if instead of the Creed we had one of the parables each week. We would hear about grain in the fields, mustard seed, and Lebanon cedar trees in whose shade birds come and shelter. If the Kingdom is like this, it can be pictured in our minds in a way the Creed never can, which is why Jesus was so happy to preach this way. He is aware that not everyone will understand, because of their unwillingness to do so. “Listen, anyone who has ears to hear!” Of course we all think we have such ears and can hear. But to hear the parables is only a start. Trees and mustard seeds are not like the clauses in the Creed, only slowly yield up their mystery.
