THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST



We tend to shy away from talk of blood. In the readings today it is impossible to ignore; body occurs only once, but blood eight times, while the Psalm response concerns a cup. The first and second readings concern blood sacrifices - literal ones that involve bleeding corpses of animals put to the knife. This may all seem incredibly primitive to us; indeed, says that such practices are no longer needed since Christ gave his own blood as a sacrifice, once for all. We must never forget this death, this blood - in fact we proclaim it until he comes again. The drinking of the cup together is a powerful symbol of this. However, you can receive Christ in only one form, so it is not accurate to call the host the body and what is drunk the blood. Both are body-and-blood, otherwise we do not follow the saying in John 6:53, which we will hear on Sunday 20th August: if you do not eat the the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in vou.
