The Ascension from the mountain on the fortieth day is marked on this Feastday . The end of John's Gospel we have heard recently. Forty days is a symbolic number, associated with Jesus' temptation; most likely it is used to represent the testing of the disciples, who do not start preaching in Jesus's name until he has left them and sent the Holy Spirit. And yet it is not the manner of Jesus' departure which should detain us, otherwise we are liable to be rebuked like the apostles: *Why are you Galileans standing here looking into the sky?* These words are only in Acts; and it is worth noting the differences between this account and the Gospel, which concludes with the disciples *worshipping* Jesus, something not said before, in other words a culmination. Luke ends, too, in the Temple, where it began. Does Christ's departure leave us with the Real Absence? No, we should not stand looking up to the sky; Christ is in us and around us.
