### **WORLD DAY OF THE POOR**

### **DEVELOPING WORLD GROUP**

On 13 November the Group paid the final instalment - £1,401 - towards its latest project. This involved funding the purchase of £5,016 of medical equipment to help mothers in childbirth and very young children at St Daniel Comboni Catholic Hospital, Wau South Sudan. We are now raising money for a small project in South Africa. Our aim is to pay for a large wood stove (to cook food and provide heat), a table and chairs for a youth centre in a township in the Dundee diocese in Natal. The beneficiaries are mainly orphans from across the township, who meet and learn practical skills at the centre. The cost is estimated to be close to £800. The priest working with the local community on this and other local projects, Father Gerald Gosling, whom Sister Regina has worked with in the past, met the Group here last month. He explained the pressing need for this equipment at the centre, which does not receive government grants, relying instead entirely on donations. .

Between 10 October and 13 November, cash and cheque donations to the DWG amounted to £1,058.01 (of which £131.95 came from Green DWG collection boxes - please ring 760295 if yours is full or hand them in at the office). This was supplemented by final profits of £685 from Pop-up Opera and £438 in Standing Orders over calendar October. Thank you all for your generosity and for supporting fundraising activities so actively.
