

ASH WEDNESDAY

Next Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, Masses will be celebrated at 9.15am and 6.00pm, and the ashes blessed and distributed. Ash Wednesday is also a day of fasting and abstinence, one of just two days in the year, when we are asked to refrain from eating meat, and to eat considerably less than usual.

LENT

It's good to mark Lent in some positive way. Below are some of the opportunities available in the parish. In addition to these there is the, almost, daily Mass. A good way of marking Lent, if not daily, then perhaps once or twice during the week.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

A traditional Lenten devotion is the Stations of the Cross. We are fortunate in our church to have such fine artwork to illustrate Jesus' last journey to Calvary, and to assist us when we reflect on this journey. The "Stations" will take place each Sunday of Lent at 6.00pm – a good activity for Lent.

LENT GROUPS

The groups will begin meeting in the week beginning 19th February for 6 weeks. All details can be found in the Invitation leaflets. This year we shall be reflecting on the Gift of the Holy Eucharist using the Diocesan Programme. "We adore you, O Christ, and we praise You" Please do join a group if you possibly can. There is no pressure on anyone to speak. We shall read scripture, pray, share ideas and stories and enjoy fellowship with coffee and biscuits.

DEVELOPING WORLD GROUP

New project

The Group is currently raising £5,768 for a new project in Uganda. The money will help finance the construction of large water tanks in the ground, and related piping/pumps for St Martin de Pores parish centre (with schools) in Lukome, near Gulu in Northern Uganda. Our aim is to send the total amount, against receipts, by end February - the first £2,000 was sent on 30 January - so that the project can if possible be completed before the wet season which begins around April. On 9th January donations of £1,165.66 were credited to our account. A further £602.50 from the Barn Dance, £890 from the Lea Singers 23rd December Christmas concert and £683.30 from the Green Box collection on 20/21 January has also been paid in or will be very soon. The Green Box total is tremendous, especially as this excludes a large number of Green Boxes handed in one by one over the last year.
